- Changed to Delaware County on September 26, 1789
- Named after Thornbury, Gloucestershire, England, the birthplace of Ann Gainer Pearce. Pearce's husband, George Pearce, was granted title to 490 acres in the Township by William Penn in 1685.
- Public transportation is available by train and bus
- Area 9.26 square miles
- Population-3,653 (1980 census)--4,723 (1990 census)-5,787 (2000 census)
- Distance to center city Philadelphia is 25 miles or 50 minutes
- Thornbury is 74% residential, 1% commercial and 1 0% industrial, and 15% institutional
